EXPLANATION:

This emergency order opens the State of Alaska winter antlered bull moose hunting season in Game Management Units 17B and 17C under registration moose hunt permit RM585. The hunting season will open at 12:00 am on December 1, 2025. This season will close on December 31, 2025, at 11:59 pm, or by Emergency Order if quota is met. To participate, hunters must possess a valid 2025 Alaska state hunting license, and a state registration permit (RM585) available at the Dillingham Fish & Game office or online. Hunters will be allowed to shoot one antlered bull if they have registration permit RM585 in their possession.

This emergency order does not affect any other moose hunting regulations in Unit 17.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the following regulations in **5AAC 85.045(15), Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Moose**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

JUSTIFICATION:

The *may be announced* winter registration moose hunt RM585 in Game Management Units 17B&C will open on December 1, 2025. An additional opportunity during the winter season for both 17B&C is warranted given the population estimate of 3,629 moose and the November 2025 composition survey showing high bull-to-cow ratios. These conditions indicate the population can sustain some additional bull harvest. Registration hunt RM585 will close on December 31 at 11:59 pm or by Emergency Order if harvest quota is met.

A portion of Unit 17C is closed to hunting this winter under RM585. The closure area is enacted due to high accessibility from the road system and puts those moose at risk of overharvest. The “West Wood River Closure” is as follows: Starting at the mouth of the Wood River, west of the Wood River along the south shore of the Wood River continuing along the south shore of Lake Aleknagik, across the mouth of both Sunshine and Lillie creeks, north to the south shore Lake Nerka, east of the mouth of Pike Creek, continuing west along the south shore of Little Togiak Lake, west to the Unit 17A boundary, following the Unit 17A/17C boundary south to the headwaters of the Weary River, east down the Weary River to the confluence of the Snake River and from the Snake River to Bristol Bay back north to the Wood River.

Registration permits will be available in person at the Dillingham ADF&G office and online beginning November 28. Successful hunters are required to report to the Dillingham ADF&G office in person or by phone (907-842-2334) **within 3 days of killing a moose**. All permit reports must be returned to ADF&G, regardless of success, within 15 days of the close of the season.

As a reminder, those who were successful in harvesting one moose anywhere in the state are unable to participate in this hunt.

It is important that hunt permittees return their fall hunt reports to provide wildlife managers the information they need to understand harvest by mailing in their paper reports, completing them online at:
