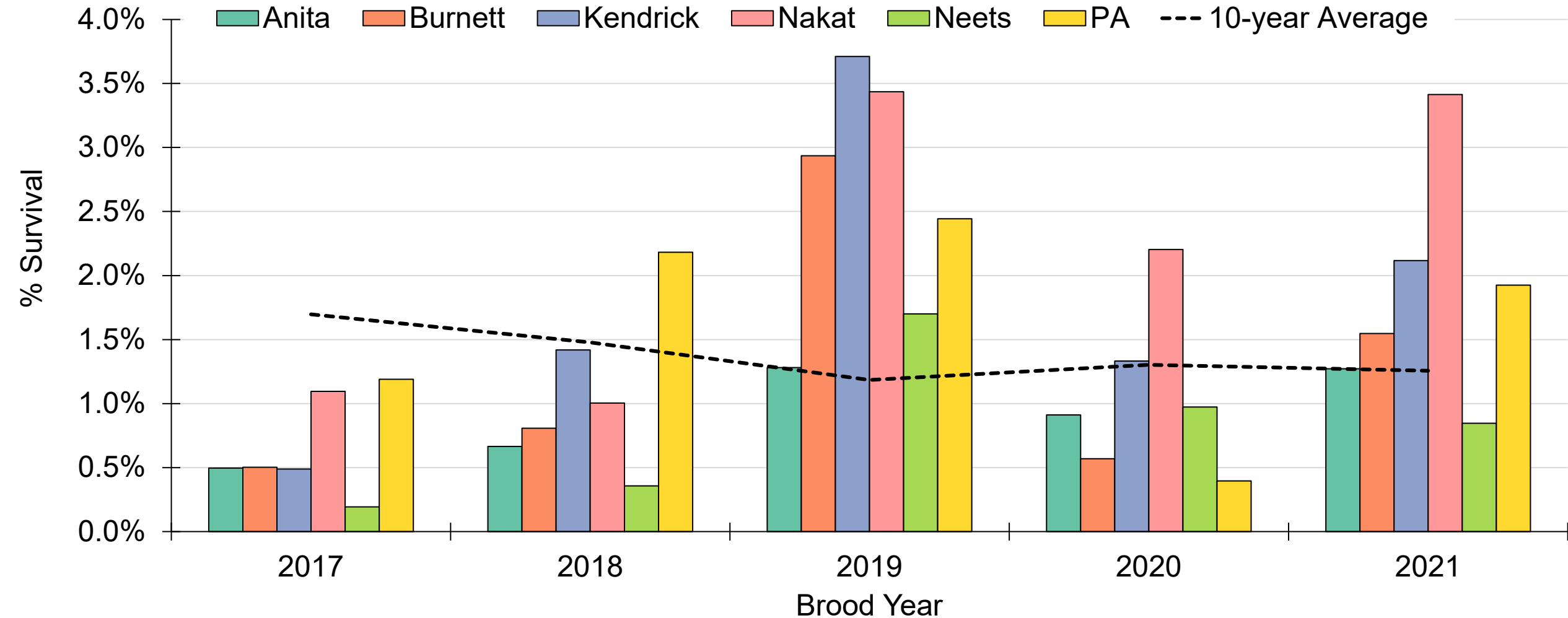
SSRAA Summer Chum Return, 2015 - 2025



Chum Age-3 Survival by Site

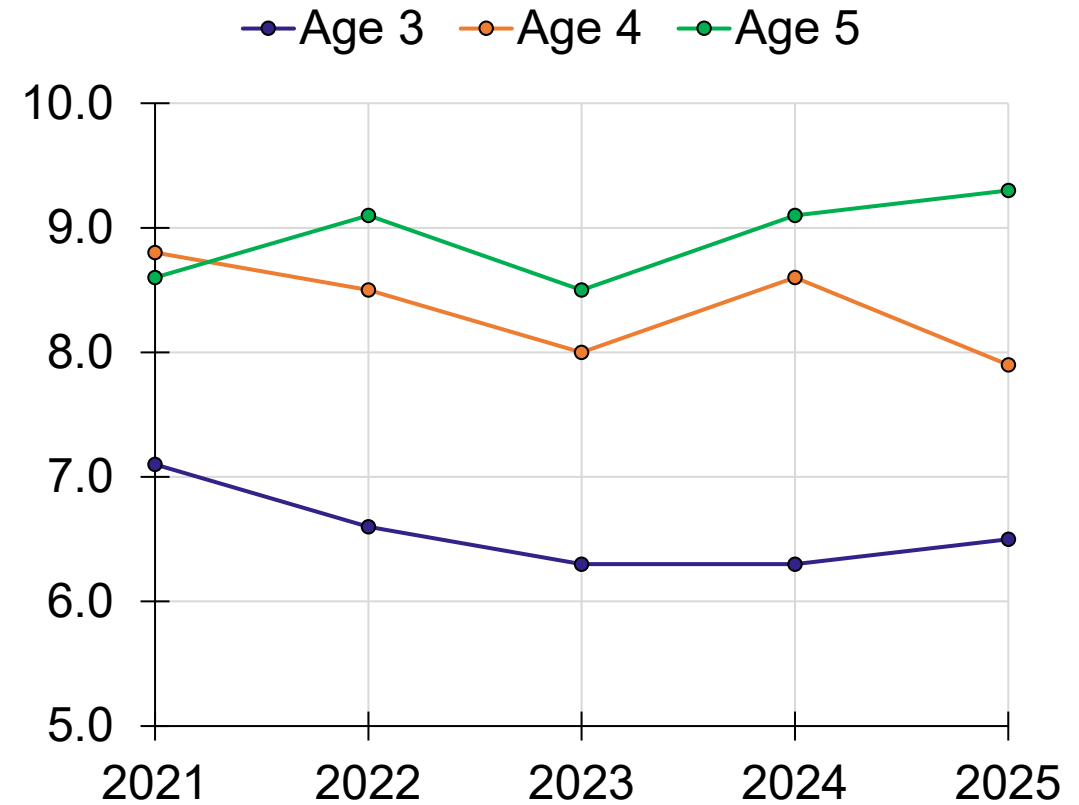


Chum Age-4 Survival by Site



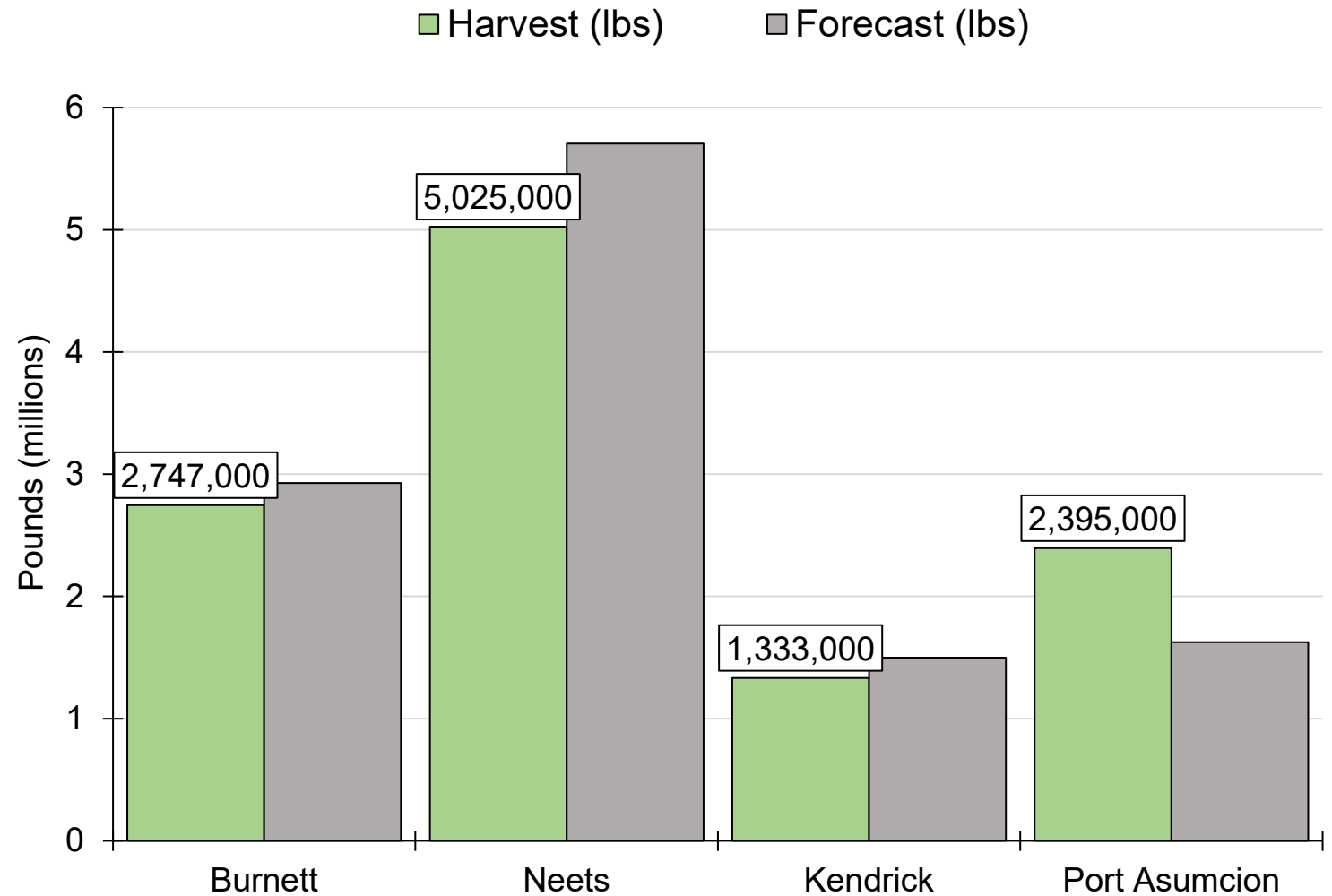
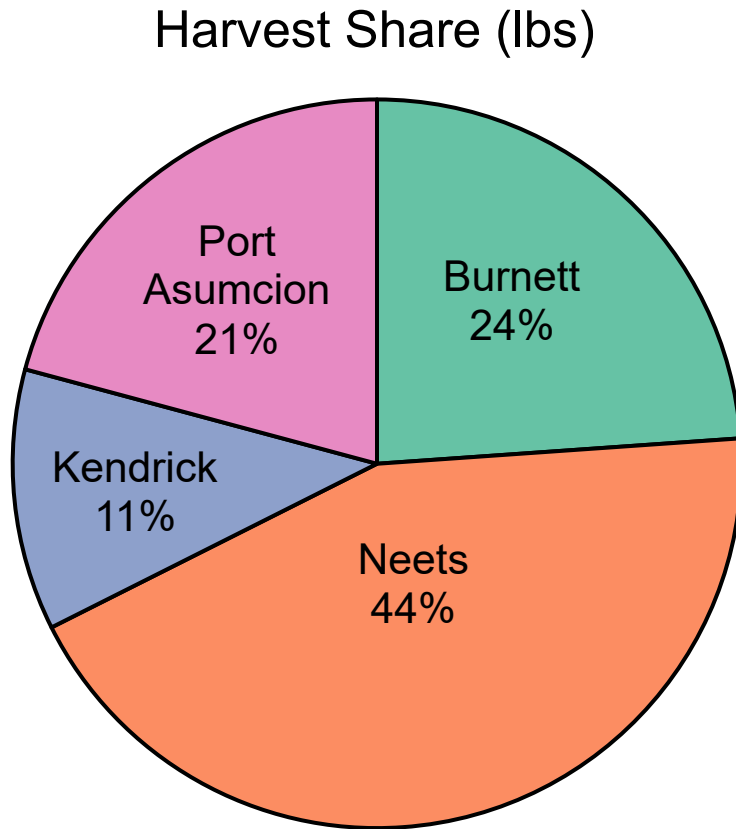

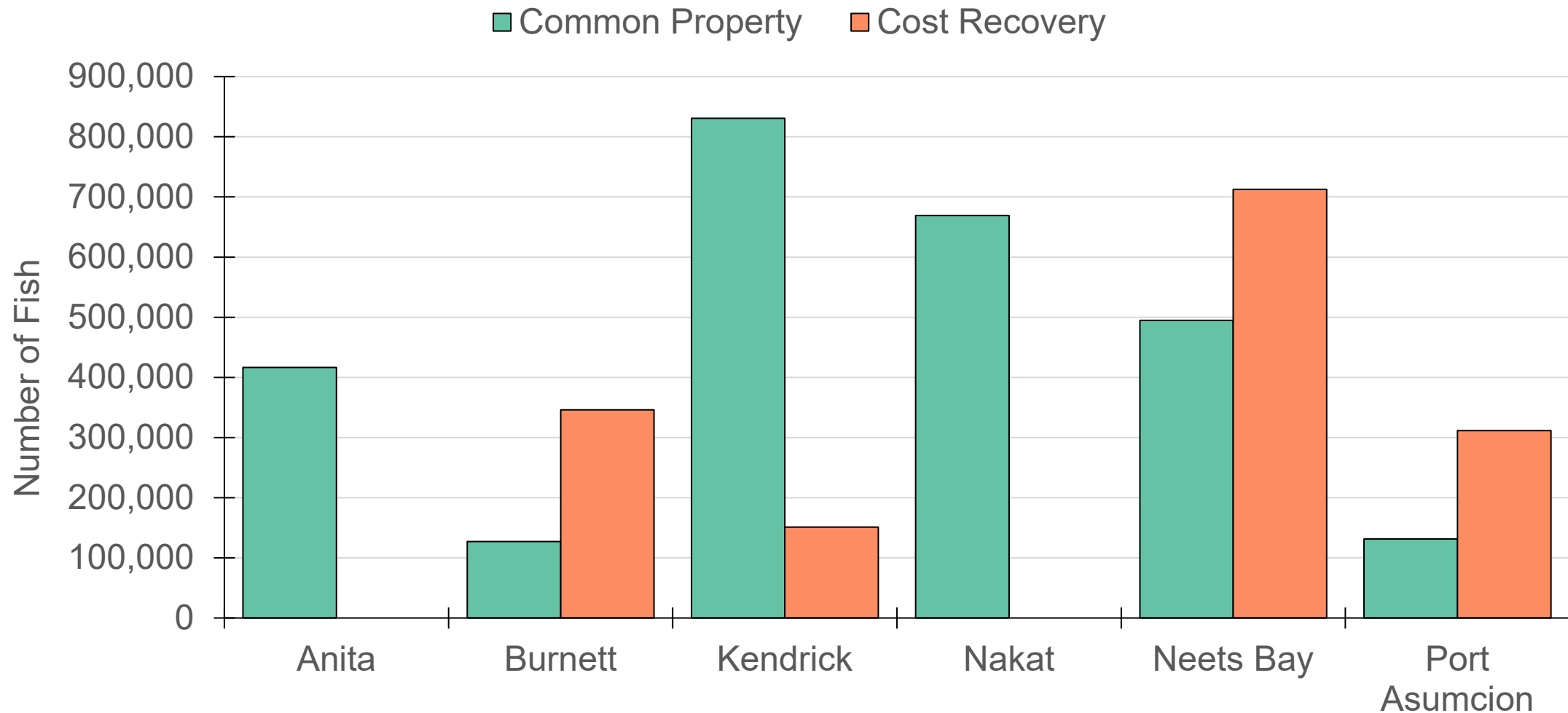


SSRAA Summer Chum Cost Recovery





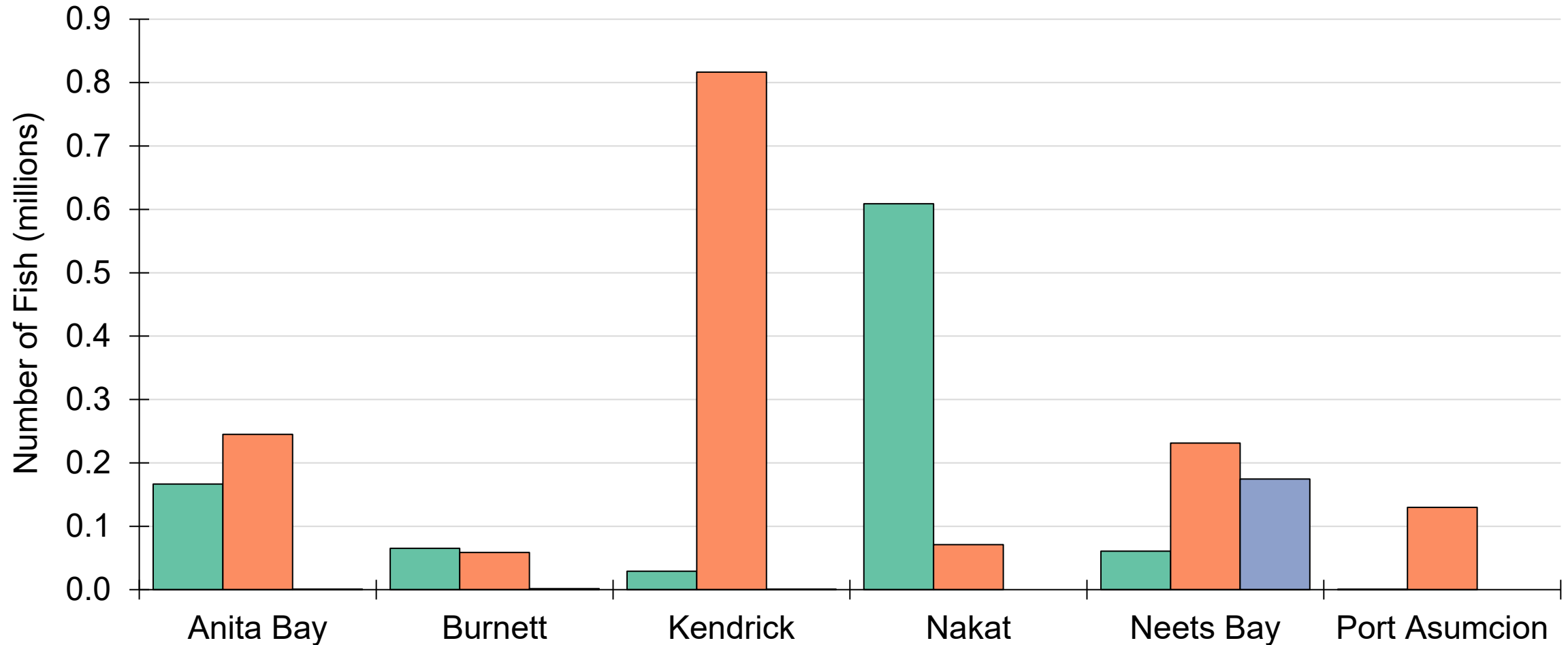
SSRAA Summer Chum Harvest Share



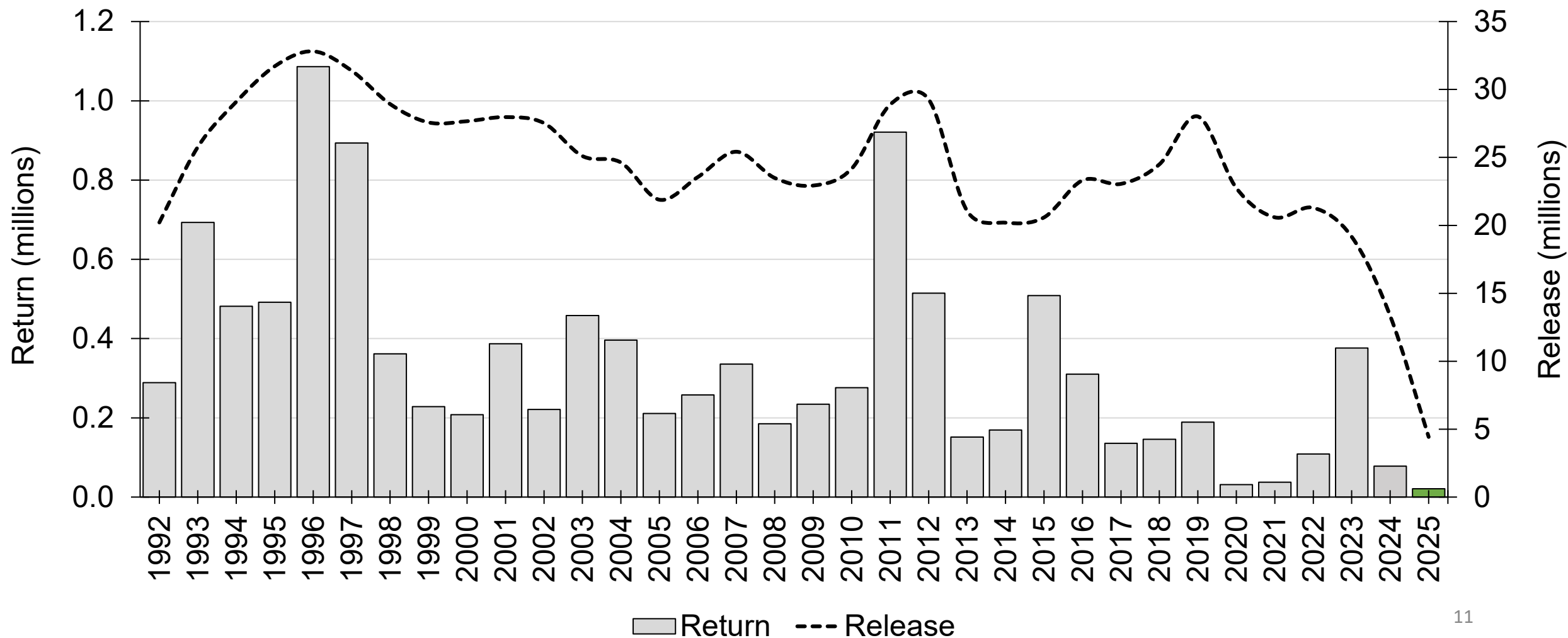


SSRAA Summer Chum Catch Share

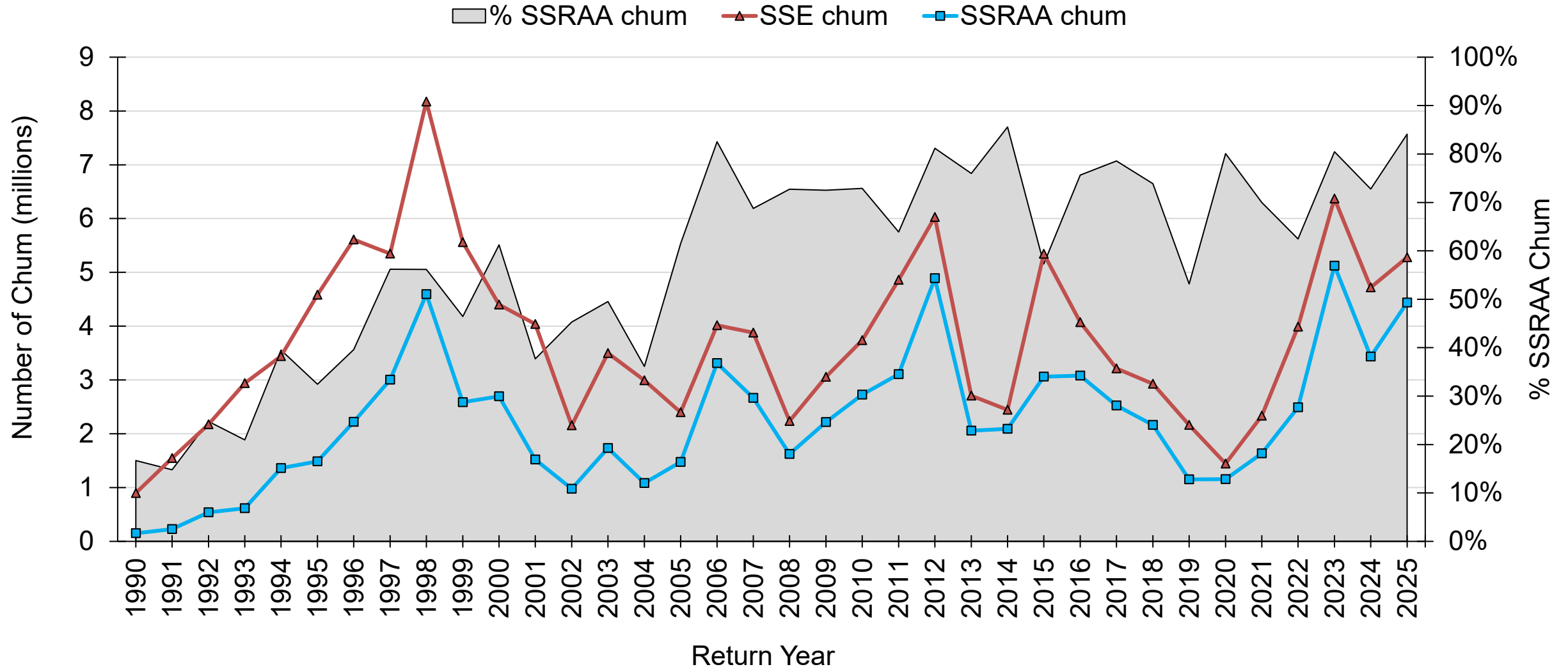

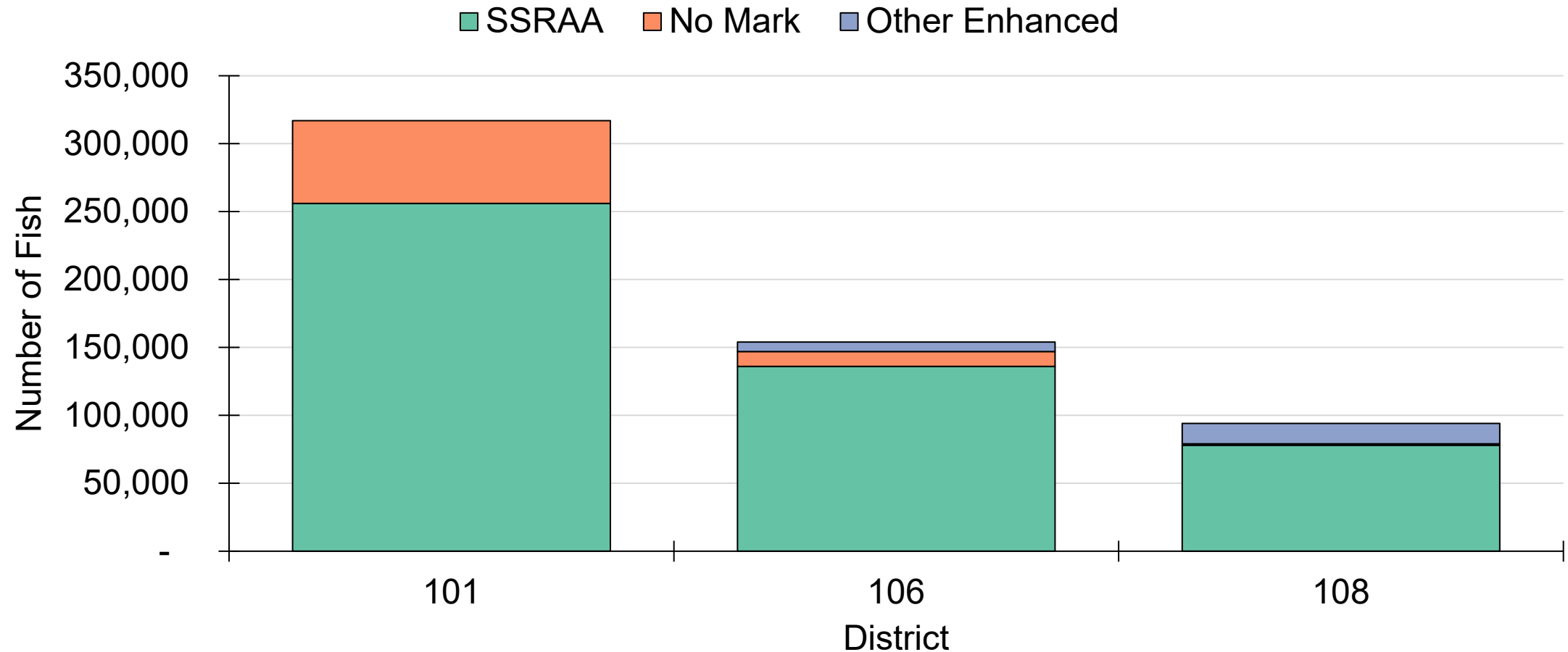


SSE AK Chum Salmon Harvest, 1990-2025



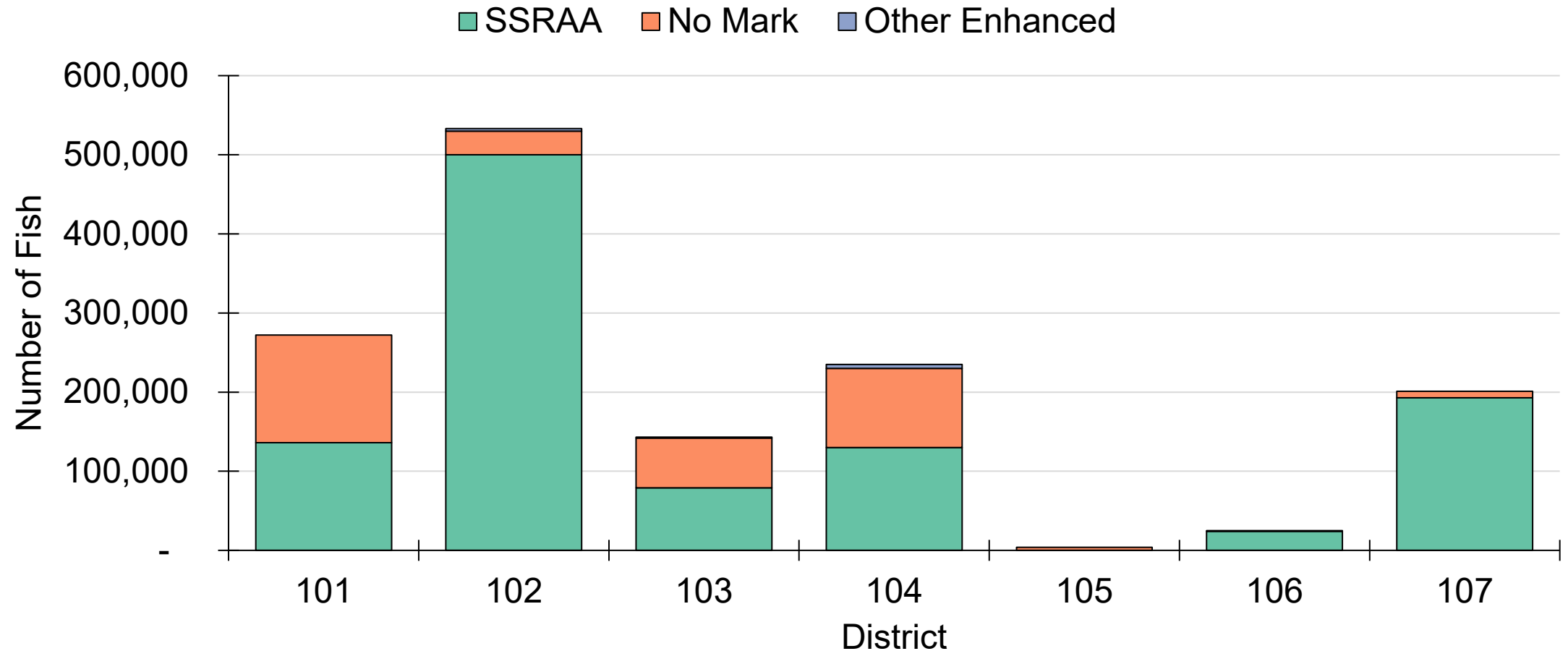


Gillnet Chum Catch Composition D1-8





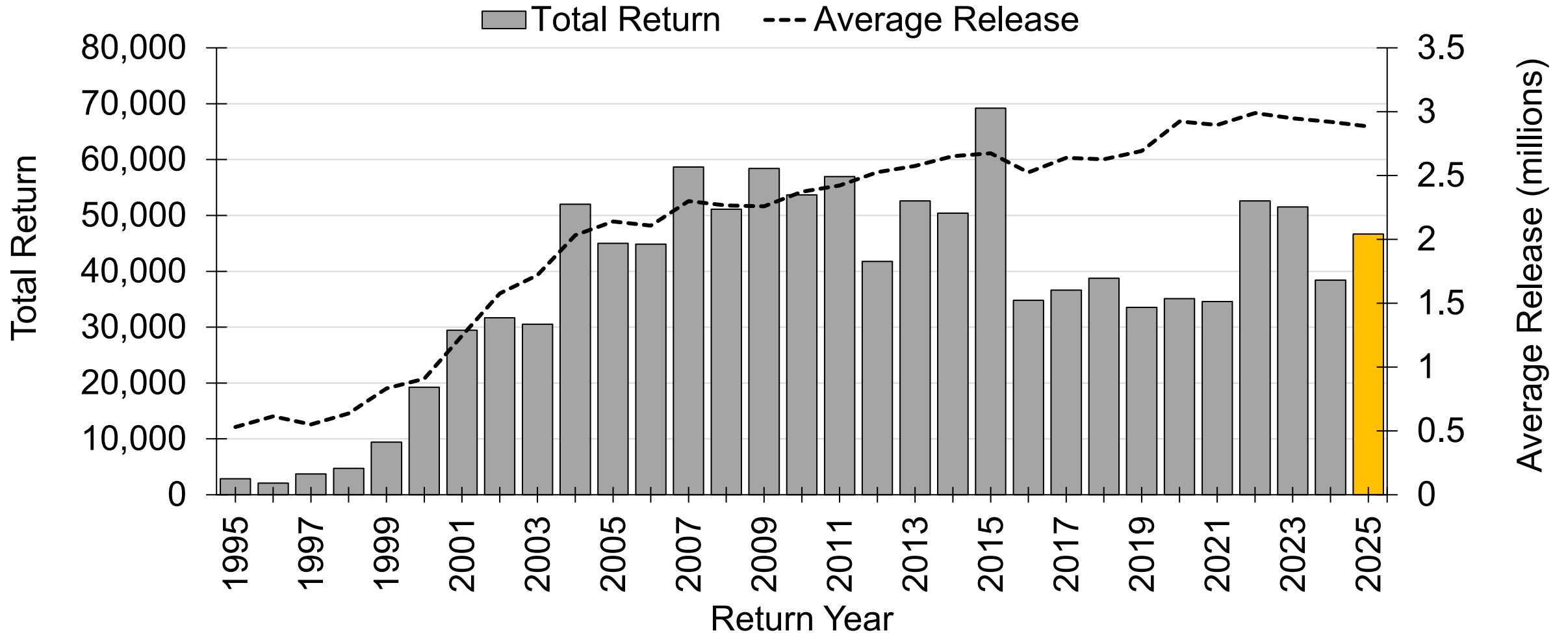
Seine Chum Catch Composition D1-8



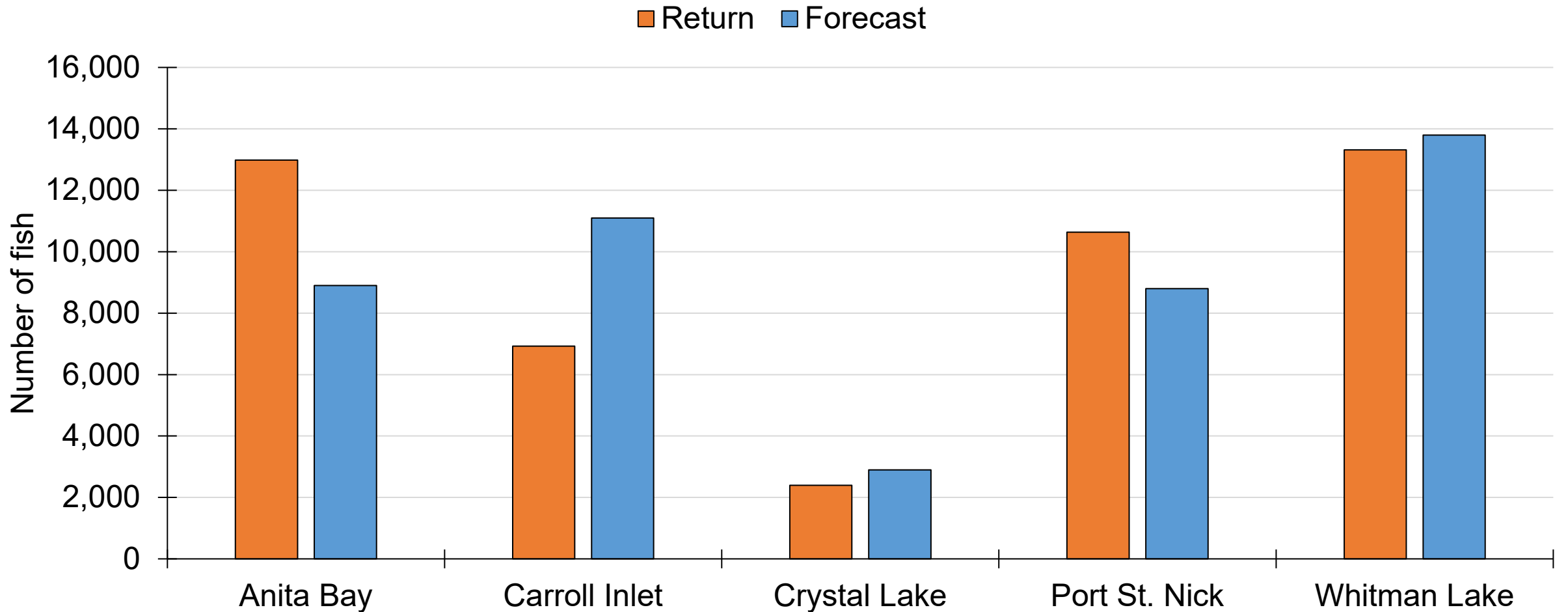

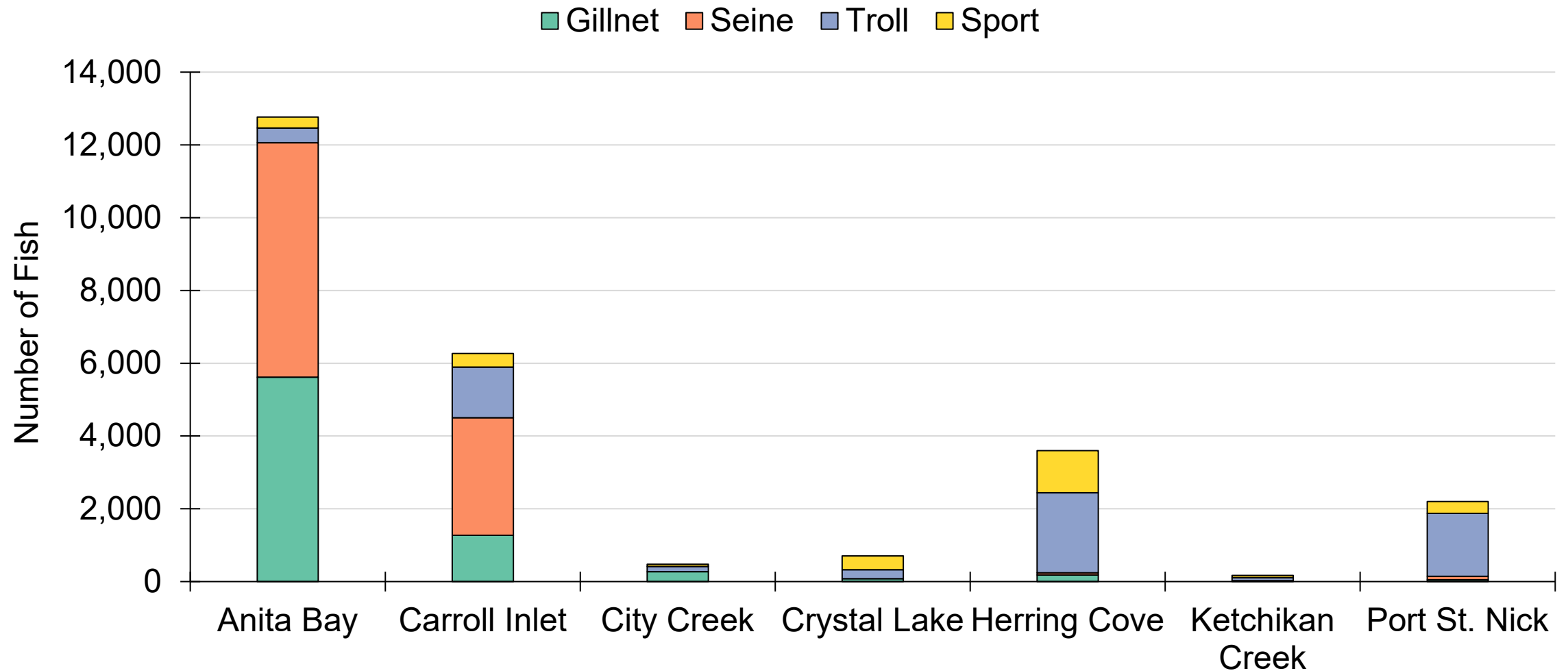


2025 Chinook Return vs. Forecast





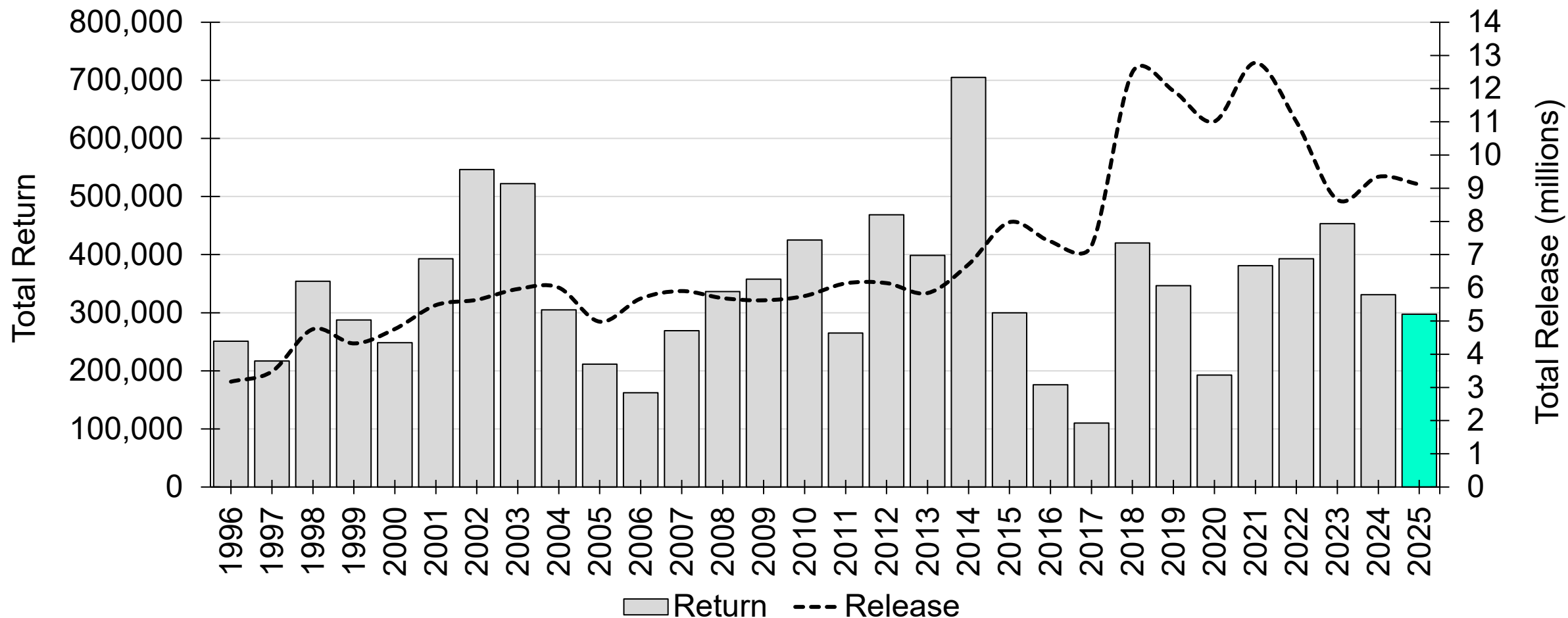

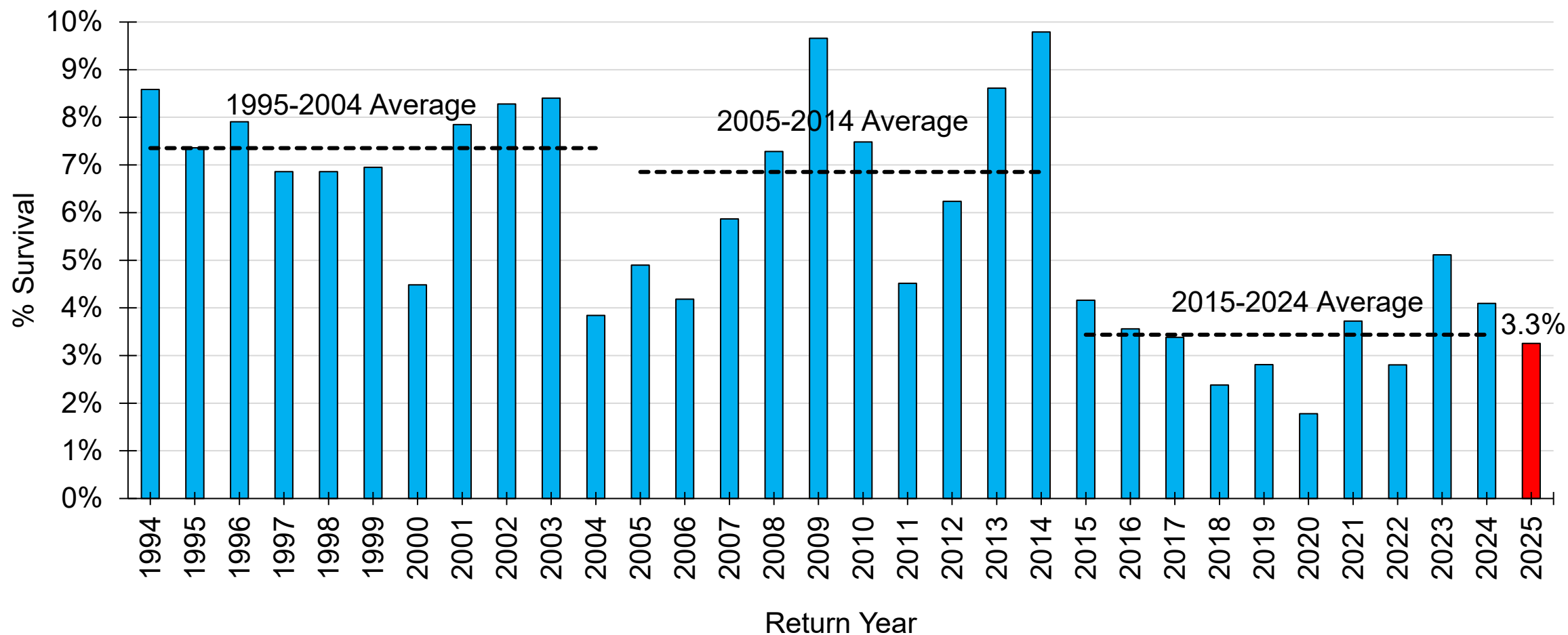

2025 Coho Return vs Forecast

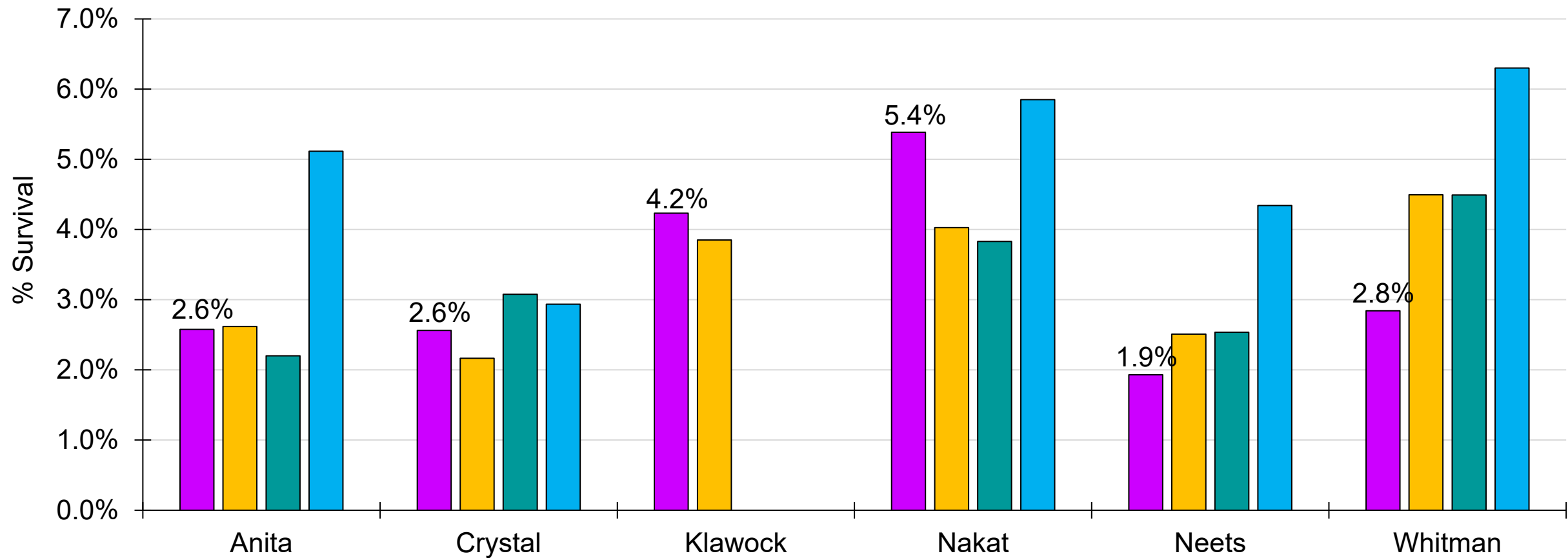


Preliminary 2025 Coho Survival



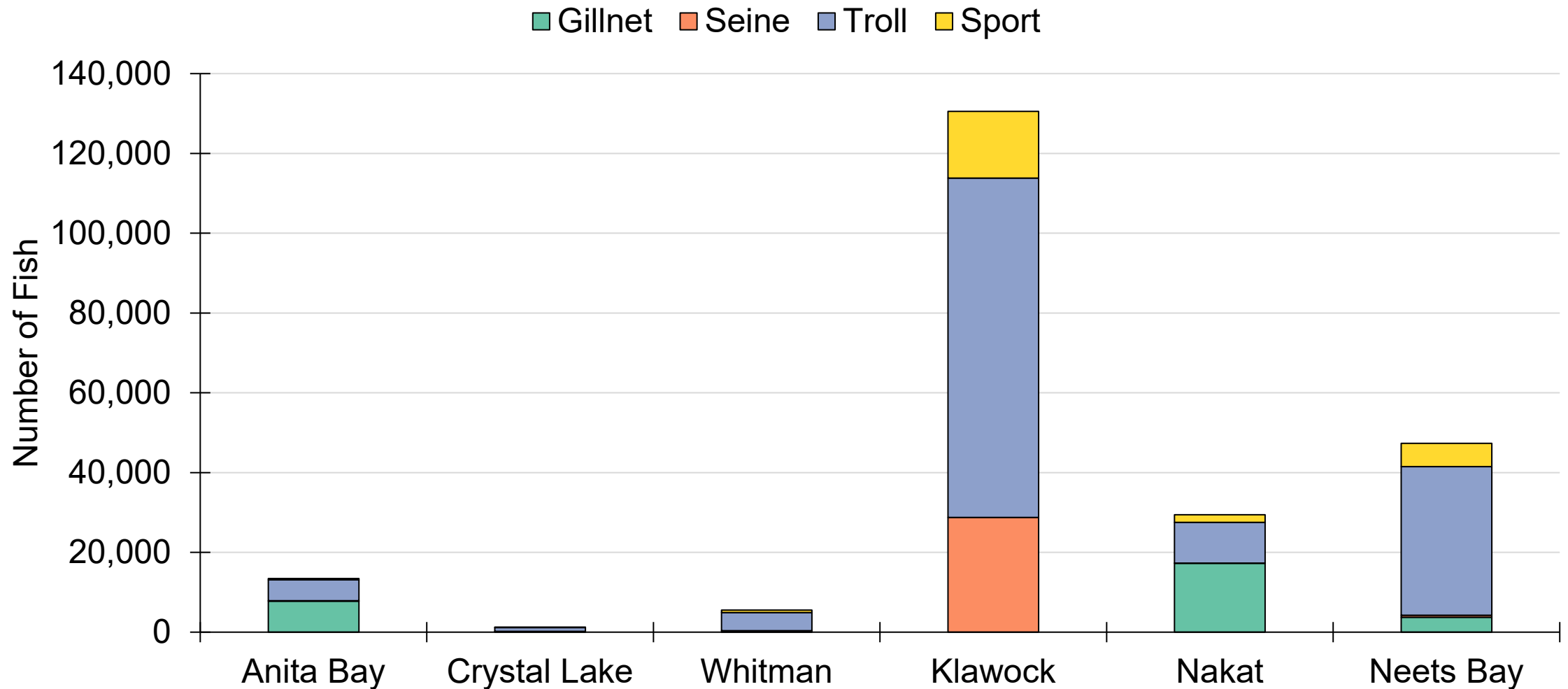

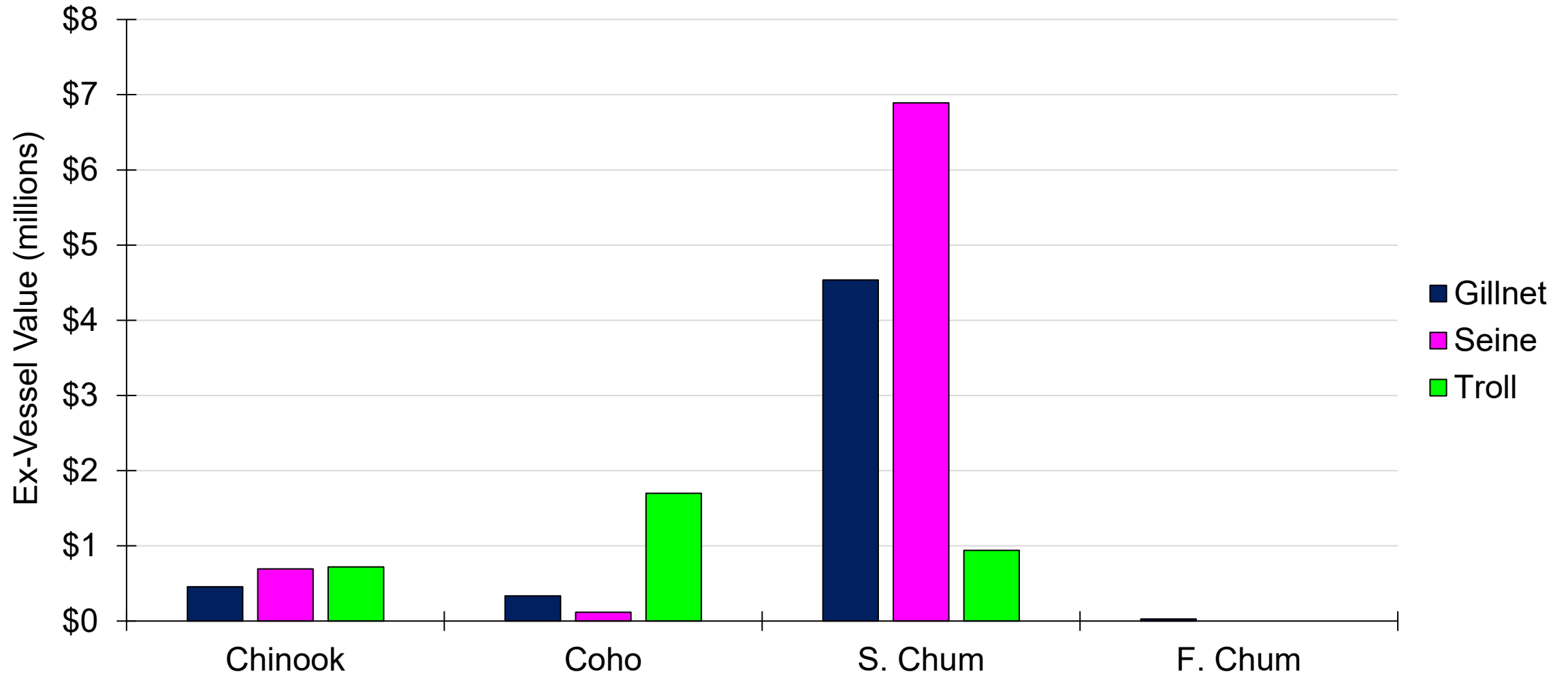

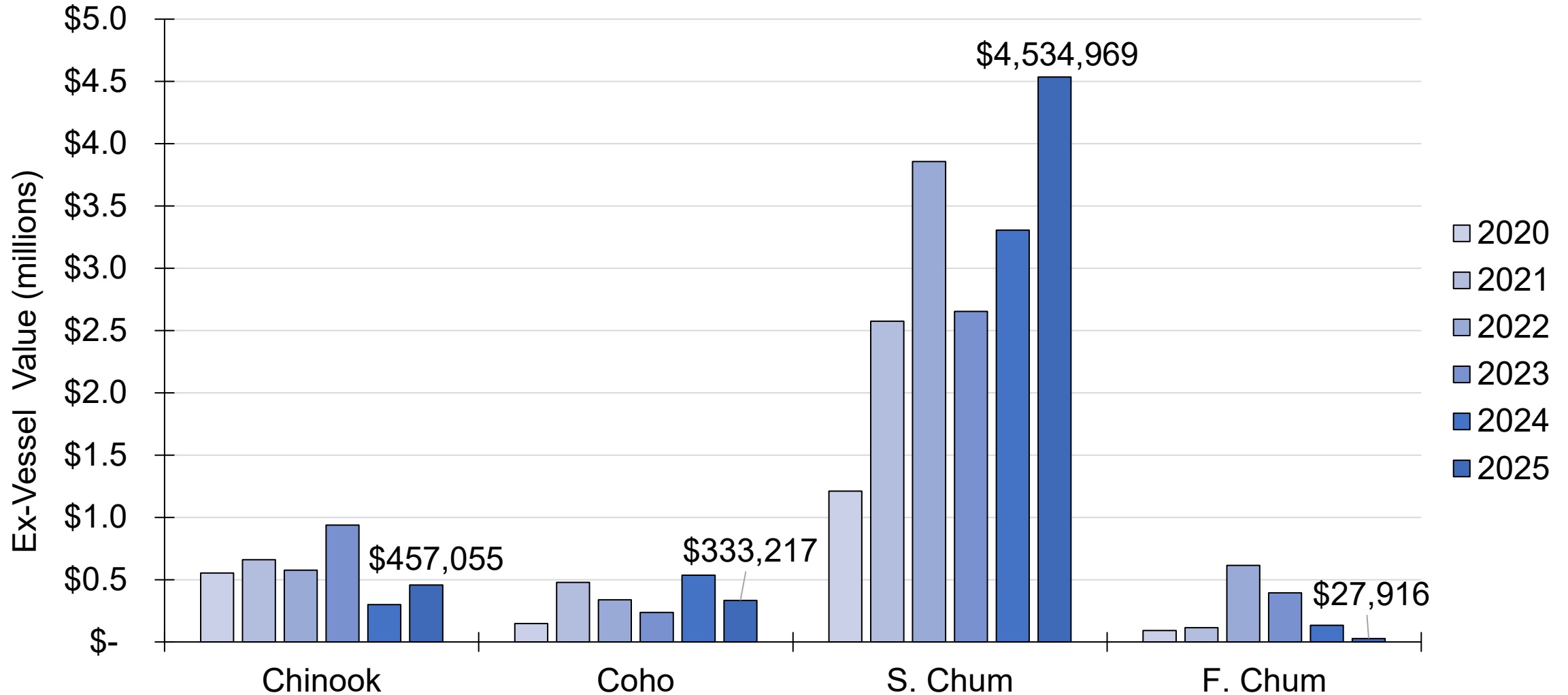


2025 SSRAA Value Estimates



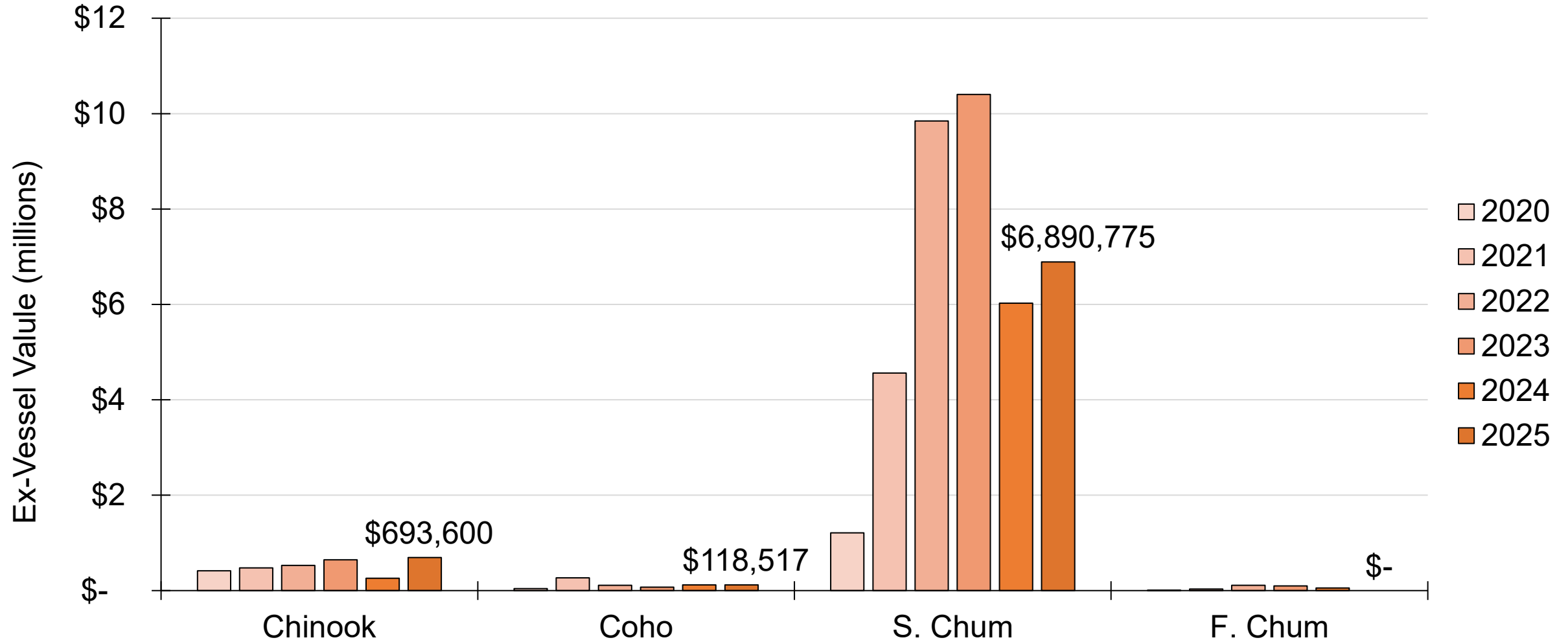


SSRAA Value Estimates - Gillnet



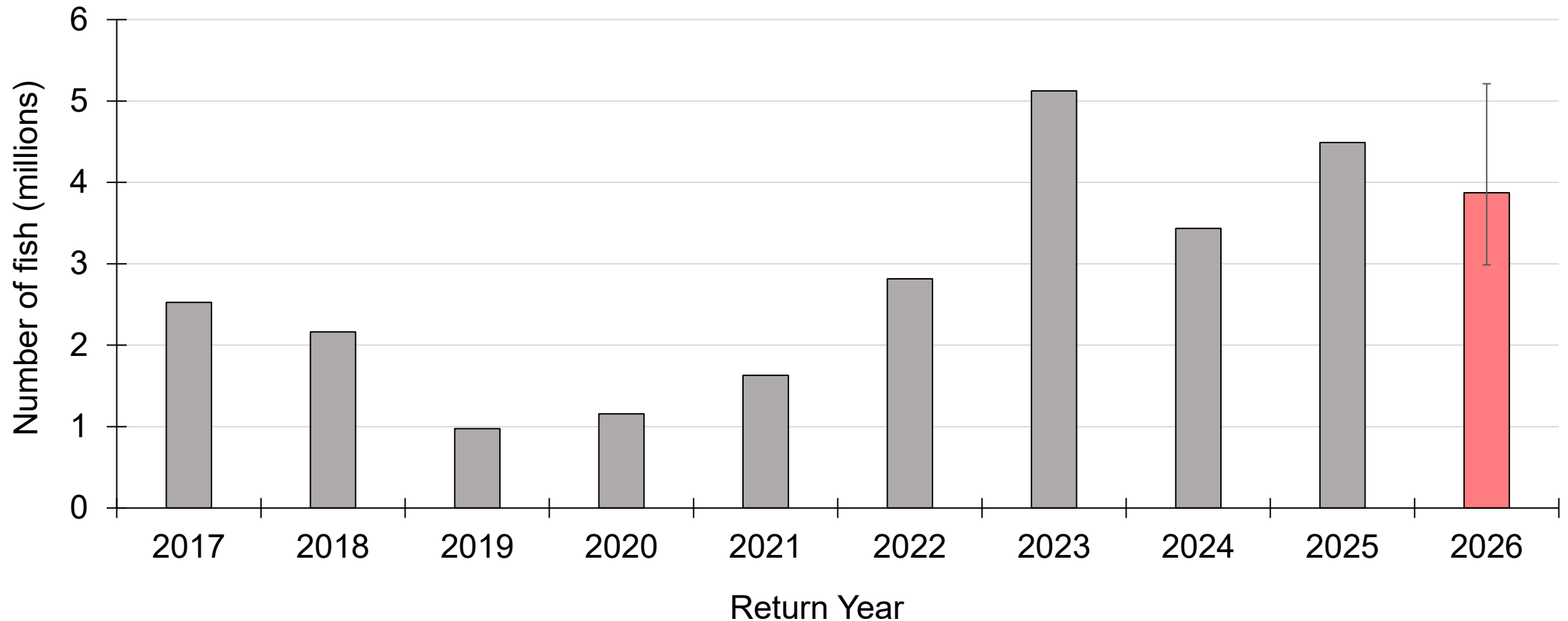
