


South Unimak & Shumagin Islands June Fishing Area and SE District Mainland Fishing Area

SE District Mainland (SEDM) Fishing Area, June 1 - July 25:

1. Established 1980: SEDM Management Plan is exclusive to this area through July 25.
2. Established 1980: 80% of sockeye harvested are considered Chignik-bound.
3. Established 1985: Economic baseline of 600,000 sockeye harvest in Chignik-bound sockeye harvest.
4. Established 1985: Harvest allocation of 6.2% of the total Chignik-bound sockeye harvest.
5. Established 1998: After July 1, all salmon caught in Northwest Stepovak Section are considered local to SEDM.
6. Established 2007: Harvest allocation of 7.6% of the total sockeye harvested in Chignik.
7. Set gillnet only through July 10, Seiners allowed July 11 - July 25.
8. SEDM Management Plan ends after July 25.




South Unimak & Shumagin Islands Fishing Area, June 1 - June 30:

1. Operates under South Unimak & Shumagin Islands June Salmon Management Plan.
2. Fishing time more than doubled & fishing area expanded in 2004.
3. Expanded area for drift gillnet in 2007.
4. Five fishing periods for set gillnet = 416 hours of fishing time.
5. Four fishing periods for drift gillnet = 352 hours of fishing time.
6. Four fishing periods for seiners = 310 hours of fishing time.
7. 32-hour closures between openings.
8. Roughly 98% of the harvest consists of stocks bound for other areas.
9. Board of Fisheries manages this fishery via regulatory action/inaction every 3 years.

SE District Mainland (SEDM) July 1 – July 25:

ALASKA PENINSULA

1. SEDM Management Plan is exclusive to this area through July 25.
2. Established 1980: 80% of sockeye harvested are considered Chignik-bound.
3. Established 1985: Economic baseline of 600,000 sockeye harvest in Chignik prior to any fishing in SEDM.
4. Established 1985: Harvest allocation of 6.2% of the total Chignik-bound sockeye harvest.
5. Established 2007: Harvest allocation of 7.6% of the total sockeye harvested in Chignik.
6. Set gillnet only through July 10, Seiners allowed July 11-July 25.
7. SEDM Management Plan ends after July 25.



South Peninsula Post-June Fishery, July 6-31:

SE District Mainland Management Plan (not part of Post-June Plan until July 26)

Non-Terminal Areas Regulatory Fishing Periods:

First fishing period begins 6:00 a.m. July 6 for 33 hours, followed by a 63-hour closure. After the first fishing period, there are six 36-hour fishing periods that begin at 6:00 a.m. interspersed by 60-hour closures. (249 hours of total fishing time)

Terminal Areas - additional fishing time may be allowed in excess of regulatory fishing periods, July 6-31

Terminal Areas - additional fishing time may be allowed in excess of regulatory fishing periods, July 22-31

From August 1 - August 31: fishing periods in the entire South Peninsula are based on abundance of local sockeye, coho, pink, and chum salmon stocks.
